

CONNECT Group study questions for May 31, 2020

“Psalm 71 - Passion”

Prayer for the Week of May 31st: This week we are praying for racial reconciliation in our country. Pray for peace. Pray for justice. Pray for safety. Pray that God would continue to change our hearts and make our church a place where people of every skin color could come to hear the gospel, be discipled, and help build the Kingdom of God. Pray that our desire would be to see our church look like the church in heaven in the last days—made up of every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages (Revelation 7:9).

This week we are also praying for all our Women’s Bible Studies that are kicking off next week. Pray for the leadership who will be teaching the Word and facilitating the meetings. And pray for the other teams of people serving during these studies. Pray with us that the clear message of the Scripture would be proclaimed, heard, and obeyed. And, as always, pray that those who don’t know Christ would come to faith in him as a result of the studies.

2. What is your passion? How can you use that passion to get the gospel and the Word of God to the next generation? Talk about this with your group. Make a plan to start now.

Take some time to pray for one another about what challenges the people in your group might be facing over the rest of the summer.
