Welcome to our Study in Esther

General Information

The book of Esther describes how the Jews who have been exiled to Persia are saved from certain destruction through God's divine providence. It shows that, though they were not in their homeland, God had not forgotten them and was still overseeing their lives and their future.

The book of Esther is unique because it tells of God's involvement with his people yet how He does it indirectly. God's name is not mentioned once, nor is there any explicit reference to God, though his influence can be seen throughout. The book demonstrates how God worked in the lives of his people, and it encourages the reader to trust Him to work in our lives today.

The author of Esther is unknown, but scholars have suggested it was possibly Mordecai, Ezra or Nehemiah. The book takes place during the reign of Persian King Xerxes, also known as Ahasuerus before his death in 465 BC. It was written in Hebrew for Jewish people.

Week 4 – Do homework, watch video called An Amazing Turn of Events – Esther 7 - 9, watch videos called Sharing Your Faith.



Discuss with the group, a friend or family members a time when you have trusted in God and the outcome was more than you could have asked or imagined (Ephesians 3:20). Share testimonies of God's faithfulness.

GOD CALLS US TO BE SALT & LIGHT EVEN IF IT'S RISKY

There was a threat on the lives of all the Jewish people because of their nationality. Their heritage made them a target of hatred, so Esther hid her identity for a time. Risking her own life, she stood up to injustice. She was in her royal position to make a difference. She had a decision to make. Would she let God use her or would she continue to hide trying to protect herself? AND what would God want her to do?



Group Activity

God is our protector and our refuge. The Lord saves the righteous and protects them in times of trouble. Discuss with the group, friend or family members a time when you've been tempted to hide your identity, play it safe or not speak up when faced with injustice, lies or oppression. Describe the situation and the outcome.



We are to let our light shine in our homes, in our neighborhoods, in our City!
God calls us to live out our true identity in Christ. We are called to be salt and light. He wants to shine through us and wants us to be on display like Queen Esther. Our good deeds glorify our Father in heaven so make a plan to do a good deed this week. Do yard work for a neighbor or housework without being asked. Watch for opportunities to serve!



Lord, help me to live for you and to be my true self as your child. I want to be salt and light and shine for you. Please forgive me when I've chosen to hide instead of letting my light shine for you. Forgive me for any times I've ignored your prompting to stand up for truth, to stand up for the weak, poor or oppressed. Prepare me Lord to stand for righteousness when faced with lies and injustice. Amen.

BECAUSE GOD IS WITH US, WE HAVE HOPE

Like Esther, it seems like we're often faced with impossible odds and it can be far too easy to lose hope. When life doesn't go as we expect, despair slowly sneaks in. Esther faced impossible odds and yet in the midst uncertain times she held two feasts...and remained hopeful. She knew she might "perish" but she still allowed God to use her. Life and circumstances might seem shaky, but we hope and can feast with confidence in an unshakeable God.



Group Activity

Do you have a friend whose faith seems unshakeable? Someone you can rely on and turn to for encouragement when the cares and concerns of life consume you? Mordecai was a great help to Esther. Like Esther, God places mentors in our lives to teach us. Tell your small group, a friend or family members about those unshakeable people you have had in your life that you choose to model. What strikes you about their character?



Salt & Light Time Set Your Mind on Things Above!

Be an encouragement for someone today who might be losing hope. Help them set their minds on things above. (Colossians 3:2). So many families are facing challenges. Send a handwritten note or card to someone with a scripture verse and words of encouragement. Maybe it's a brother or sister, an old friend or neighbor struggling with addiction, job loss or loneliness. Pray for them and send a note of "hope" in the mail.





involved. Identify one or more and start praying and fasting for the organization and the people you know who are suffering, in recovery or being persecuted. The list is endless! Also, prayerfully consider contributing financially to the organization the Lord lays on your heart.





Group Activity

In a dark world we are called to step up like Esther. There is a human role in the victories God gives. This involves prayerfully waiting and trusting in Him. What things has HE put on your heart? Discuss your thoughts and desires with the group, a friend or family members. Don't be surprised if others in your sphere of influence have similar passions, gifts and complimentary callings from the Lord. It's like God to be placing the right people in the right places together to accomplish great things for the building of his kingdom.




