Pitfalls in meeting with God

Languishing connection with God

- Lack of Fruit
- Lack of focus
- Lack of response to prayers
- Lack of desire to read the Bible or pray
- Unrepentant sin/feelings of unworthiness

Response: IOUS

- Incline (Psalm 119:36)
 - ³⁶ Incline my heart to your testimonies, and not to selfish gain!
- Open (Psalm 119:18)

 18 Open my eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of your law.
- O Unite (Psalm 86:11)

 11 Teach me your way, O Lord,
 that I may walk in your truth;
 unite my heart to fear your name.
- Satisfy (Psalm 90:14)

 14 Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.

Legalism

- <u>Justification</u> Being *declared* righteous by God: position before God
- Sanctification Being *made* righteous by God: process
