The importance of heaven and hell in the suffering of a Christian

I. Introduction

What difference does it make to know the end of something?

To suffer as a Christian means to suffer with the end of all things firmly fixed in your view.

Martin Luther: Two days on his calendar—"this day" and "that day"

II. "That Day" and Hell

(Matt. 8:12, 13:42, Mk. 9:43, 48; 2 Thes 1:9)

Rev. 14:11 "And the smoke of their torment goes up forever and ever, and they have no rest, day or night..."

Exodus 34:7b He will "by no means clear the guilty."

III. "This Day" and Hell

(Rom. 3:25-26, 3:10-11; Eph. 2:3)

Rom. 12:19 "Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord."

IV. "That Day" and Heaven

Rev. 21:4 "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."

V. "This Day" and Heaven

Philippians 3:20-21: "But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself."

Psalm 56:8: "You have kept count of my tossings; put my tears in your bottle. Are they not in your book?"

2 Corinthians 4:17-18, "For this light momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal."

Philippians 3:8 – "Indeed, I count everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ..."
