I. Memorizing God's Word

A. Why Do It? Motivations

- 1. Memorization supplies spiritual power (Ps 119:11; 1 Cor. 10:13)
- 2. Memorization strengthens faith (Pr 22:17-19)
- 3. Memorization equips us for witnessing and counseling (Pr. 25:11; Eph 4:12)
- 4. Memorization is a means of God's guidance (Ps119:24)
- 5. Memorization stimulates meditation

B. How To Do It? Methods

- 1. Decide you can
- 2. Have a plan
- 3. Write (or type) out the verses
- 4. Draw picture reminders
- 5. Memorize the whole verse, word-perfectly
- 6. Find a method of accountability
- 7. Review every day
- 8. Sing Songs

II. Meditating on God's Word

Psalm 119:97; Phil. 4:8

Definition: Meditation is deep thinking on the truths revealed in Scripture, for the purposes of understanding, application and prayer.

B. Why Do It? Motivations

- 1. Promise of success (Josh. 1:8)
- 2. Meditation produces fruit (Ps 119:98-99)

B. How To Do It? Methods

- 1. Select the verses upon which you wish to meditate
- 2. Repeat the verse in different ways
- 3. Rewrite them in your own words
- 4. Pray through the text
- 5. Don't rush!
- 6. Silence & Solitude

III. Journaling

A. Why Do It? Motivations

- 1. Helps in self-understanding and evaluation (Jer. 17:9-10)
- 2. Helps us meditate on Scripture (Ps 1:1-2)
- 3. Helps us express our thoughts and feelings to the Lord (Ps 62:8)

- 4. Helps us remember the Lord's works (Ps 77:11-12)
- 5. Helps us create and preserve a spiritual heritage
- 6. Helps us clarify and articulate our insights
- 7. Helps us monitor our goals and priorities
