## V. Commitment that is Formal

"For what have I to do with judging outsiders? Is it not those inside the church whom you are to judge? God judges those outside." – 1 Corinthians 5:12-13a

The "inside" vs. the "outside" of a church.

Hebrews 13:17 – submitting to leaders; their account for us.

What difference does formal membership make?
