- Not a passive congregation
- Not an all-powerful congregation

3.	Church membership (therefore) is an office, or job.
	• Job #1: Help preserve the gospel – (Gal. 1)
	• Job #2: Help affirm gospel citizens – (Matt. 18; 1 Cor. 5)
4.	The Church has office authority in discipline and membership (Matt. 18: 1 Cor. 5) and doctrine and leadership (Gal. 1).

1. The ministry of the Word - (Acts 6)

2. The ministry of prayer - (Acts 6)

3. The ministry of gathering and protecting – (Acts 20:28; 1 Pet. 5:2-4; Heb. 13:17)
