Unity and Diversity in the Local Church Class 6: Counsel for Christians in the Majority

Introduction: How can we love others coming from the backgrounds of the majority or the minority?

⁹Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. ¹⁰Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. ¹¹Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹²Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. ¹³Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality." –Romans 12:9-13

Five things should characterize our love for each other in the church:

1. Genuine in Affection

"Let love be genuine."

2. Self-Forgetting

"Outdo one another in showing honor."

How can those in the majority avoid assuming that everyone else sees things like they do?

- 1. Remember the "invisibility factor" of the majority culture.
- 2. Build real friendships with those who are different.
- 3. Listen to sermon application that *doesn't* apply to you.
- 4. Think about different experiences as you pray through the directory.
- 5. Put yourself in their shoes
- 6. Humbly ask questions

4. Constant

"Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer."

5. Sacrificial

"Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality."
