Questions

1. What illustration, story, or example stood out to you this week?
2. Share an experience when you've seen someone share the gospel in a meaningful way (or if you have shared the gospel). What stood out to you? Why was it so impactful to the person receiving the gospel message?
3. Read Acts 17:16-34. It's evident that Paul had spent some time getting to know the people of Athens – their culture and beliefs. What specific ways can you follow Paul's example when talking with people around you?
4. Pastor Ron shared that we are separated from God by our sin without Jesus. We are meant to be in relationship with God. What has kept you feeling separated from God in the past? How has being a Jesus follower changed your thinking about sin (your own struggles and the mistakes of others)?
5. Read 1 Corinthians 1:17-18. Why do you think the message of the cross sounds foolish to those who don't believe? What about it helps you to comprehend it as the very power of God?
6. Paul spoke to the Athenians about their religion. When has religion gotten in the way of you following Jesus? How do you speak to someone who might be struggling with the religious aspect of believing in Him? How does sharing your personal story make a difference in that discussion?
7. What one practical step do you plan to implement from this week's message?
