- 5. The Rise of the **Bible:** Confirmation of the Christian Canon
 - The Old Testament
 - **Composed:** (c. 1400-430BC)
 - Collected: 400's BC, per Josephus
 - **Confirmed:** By Christ, Christian Apostles, and Judaism
 - o The New Testament
 - Composed: (c. AD 40-90)
 - Collected: First Century (Col. 4:16)
 - **Confirmed:** By Apostles (2 Peter 3:16); Apostolic Fathers, Athanasius Easter Letter of 367, and Council of Carthage in 397
