Mormonism's History: Where Did It Come From?

- 1. It's Soil: The Denominational Confusion in New England After the Second Great Awakening (1820's).
- 2. It's Roots: The Visions of Joseph Smith (1820-1823).
- 3. It's **Shoots**: The Founding of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in New York by Joseph Smith (1830).
- 4. It's Fruits: The Founding of Salt Lake City as Mormon Headquarters by Brigham Young (1847).



Mormonism's Authority: What Do They Read?

1.	The Book of Mormon—Another Testament
	of Jesus Christ: A record of God's dealings
	with the inhabitants of ancient America from
	2000 BC to 400 AD.

 Doctrines and Covenants: A collection of "revelations and inspired declarations given for the establishment and regulation of the Mormon Church in the last days (1830-1978 AD).

 The Pearl of Great Price: A selection of revelations, translations, and writings of Joseph Smith

4. The KJV Bible: Understood to be the Word of God, along with the Book of Mormon, "as far as it is translated correctly." Mormon KJV Bible heavily footnoted.

Mormonism's Theology: What Do They Teach?

- 1. **Trinity:** The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are three distinct gods amongst thousands.
- 2. **God**: God the Father was once a man and progressed to godhood and is now an immortal man.
- 3. Christ: The firstborn spirit-child of the Father, who progressed to deity in the spirit world and was later physically conceived in Mary's womb.
- 4. **Man:** Possess the same potential as God the Father to progress to godhood.
- 5. Sin: Adam's sin was a noble act making mortality possible, which is necessary to progress to godhood.
- 6. Salvation: Christ's atonement secures immortality for all, whether they repent or not.



- 7. Heaven: Most will end up in one of three kingdoms of glory, depending on faithfulness: Celestial Glory (for Mormons and Good People Unaware of Mormonism)
 Terrestrial Glory (for Unworthy Mormons or Good People Who Rejected Mormonism) or Telestial Glory (for Wicked People).
- 8. Hell: The Lake of Fire is reserved for the Devil, demons, and those who commit the unpardonable sin.
- 9. The Church: The Mormon Church is a restoration of the early church that became apostate.
