Presbyterian History: Where Did They Come From?

- **Soil:** Originates in Geneva with John Calvin (1509-1564).
 - Further Reformed Church
 Government: Presbyterian (from the Greek presbuteros, "elder.")
 - Further Reformed Theology: Calvinism (Reformed Theology)
- Roots: Develops in Scotland with John Knox (1514-1572)
 - Brought Protestant Reformation to Catholic Scotland
 - Brought Calvin's Reforms to the new Church of Scotland.



- **Shoots:** Develops in England with the *Westminster Standards* (1643-1649).
 - Calvin and Knox's Reforms Led to the English Civil War (1642-1651).
 - Parliament Reformed Church of England with Westminster Assembly's Westminster Standards (1643-1653).
- Fruits: Spreads to North America and Subdivides Due to Controversies (1706-Present).
 - Subdivided Over Revivalism: Old Side vs. New Side Presbyterianism
 - Subdivided Over Slavery: Presbyterian Church, US (PCUS) vs United Presbyterian Church, USA (UPCUSA)
 - Subdivided
 Over Liberalism: Presbyterian Church,
 USA (PCUSA) vs. Presbyterian Church
 in America (PCA) and Evangelical
 Presbyterian Church (EPC) and
 Orthodox Presbyterian Church (OPC)

Presbyterian Theology: What Do They Believe?

 Westminster Confession of Faith: Puritan Confession of Faith Originally Drafted for Church of England. Later Adopted by Church of Scotland and Many Presbyterian Churches. Influenced Similar Confessions of Faith for Baptist and Congregationalists.

 Westminster Shorter and Longer Catechisms: Doctrinal Questions and Answers for the Purpose of Memorization.

 Directory of Public Worship: Sometimes called the Westminster Directory, it is a liturgical handbook designed to replace the Church of England's Book of Common Prayer.

 Form of Church Government: Outlines Presbyterian Church Polity



Presbyterian Distinctives: What Distinguishes Them?

- How They Govern: Presbyterian Polity
 - Session: Local Church Leadership Consisting of Ruling and Teaching Elders
 - Presbytery: Regional Gathering of Local Church Sessions
 - Synod: Regional Gathering of Presbyteries. Typically Convenes for Disciplinary Purposes.
 - General Assembly: National Gathering of Denomination
- Who Can Pastor: Education Requirements for Ordination
- Who Should Be Baptized: Infant Baptism
- How To Interpret the Bible: Covenant Theology
- How God Saves: Sovereignty of God in Salvation
