New Covenant | Jeremiah 31:31-34

QUESTIONS FOR STUDY

- 1. Describe a time when you were given hope in a difficult situation. Briefly explain what made the situation difficult and how you were given hope.
- 2. The Bible understands hope to be a **confident assurance in God's promises**, and in the God who stands behind those **promises** (see Hebrews 11:1). What stands out to you in this definition of hope? Are there ways this differs from ways you have understood hope before? Explain.
- 3. In the time that Jeremiah wrote his book, Judah (the nation that Jeremiah is writing to) is facing a difficult situation. As a group, do your best to identify 3-4 ways that God's people are facing a difficult situation. To help you with this, consider what you know from reading Jeremiah (and other prophets you've read so far), what you may remember from 1-2 Kings, etc.
- 4. God's people are facing a difficult situation both externally (the threat of foreign superpowers) and internally (sin, disobedience, and rebellion against God). **Now read Jeremiah 31:31-34** and answer the following questions.
 - Look closely at Jeremiah 31:33-34. What are the features of this "New Covenant"?
 - Summarize or "bottom line" these features in your own words. What is God promising His people here?
 - How would this New Covenant promise have offered hope?
- 5. The New Testament lets us know that Jesus fulfilled the Old Covenant, and that the New Covenant was inaugurated in His death and resurrection (see, for e.g., Matthew 5:17 and 2 Corinthians 3:7-11).

Look at the following New Testament passages and share how the New Covenant promises of Jeremiah 31:31-34 are now realized because of what Jesus has done. (If time is tight, choose 1-2 of these to work through as a group, and come back to the rest on your own.)

- What do we learn about the **internal transformation** that God brings about, from Ephesians 2:1-10?
- What do we learn about **being part of God's family** from 1 Peter 2:9-10?
- What do we learn about access to God from Hebrews 4:14-16?
- What do we learn about **forgiveness of sins** from Romans 4:5-8?
- 6. Choose one of these features of the New Covenant that Jeremiah prophesied about, and that Jesus makes available. How do you need to "grab ahold" of this truth in a fresh way in your own life?
- 7. Why is hope such an important characteristic for followers of Jesus to cultivate? How can what you've learned from Jeremiah 31:31-34 motivate your own hope-filled living and glad obedience this week?
