

## Community Group Discussion Guide Sunday, April 24, 2016

## Everybody Wins, When Humility Prevails 2 Kings 5:1-19a

## Introduction

This is the final week of our "Everybody Wins" series. The 'win' we're talking about isn't something like winning a competition in sports or some other kind of endeavor. It's becoming the person God created you to be and living a life that honors God and helps others.

Sunday's sermon points to this principle: To have a relationship with God takes humility, not greatness.

Please read 2 Kings 5:1-19 before answering the following questions.

- 1. What does it mean when someone's described as "a self-made man" / "a self-made woman"?
- 2. How does it potentially make it more challenging for a very successful person to see their need of God?
- 3. Have you ever met someone who telling their own spiritual journey to God say that it took a hard time in their life to open their eyes to their need of God? If yes, what did they say did it for them?
- 4. Write down everything you learn about Naaman in the first three verses of 2 Kings chapter 5.
- 5. What did God use in Naaman's life to open his heart to seeking God's help?
- 6. What do you find in reading verses 4-6 that shows Naaman's attempt to impact the end result of his meeting with Israel's king?
- 7. What did Elisha do in response to Naaman's need for healing? Clue: His response wasn't how people normally respond to someone who has power and influence.
- 8. Why do you think Naaman was so angered by the instructions given to him to wash himself in the Jordan river?
- 9. What did Naaman say after he was healed that reveals the change in his heart toward God?
- 10. How might you use Naaman's story as an example of God's grace in sharing the gospel with another person?
