



Questions for Study and Group Discussion

- ** Read Acts 4:1-31 as a group before answering these questions.
- 1. Think of someone you would describe as "courageous." What about this person makes them courageous? Explain.
- 2. Look back through Acts 4:1-31. Create a list of ways you see courage played out in this passage.
- 3. Look back at the list you just created (question #2). As you see all these observations compiled together, what thoughts or take-aways come to mind? Why?
- 4. Read Acts 1:8. As followers of Jesus carry out this mission He's given us, why is courage important?
- 5. What specific steps of courage do you need to take as a follower of Jesus, in light of what you've see in Acts 4? Share your response(s) with the group.
- 6. Alongside courage, we also see dependence on God in this passage. Look again at Acts 4:23-31. In what ways do you see "dependence" in this passage?
- 7. What are the believers here depending on God to do? What stands out to you about their requests?
- 8. What big things are you depending on God for? What lessons can you learn about dependence from Acts 4:23-31?
- 9. "Bold dependence" isn't a pair of words many people think of putting together. From what you've seen in Acts 4, why should followers of Jesus be characterized by "bold dependence" (boldness AND dependence)?
- 10. What's one practical take-away you can make in your life this week, based on what you've learned in Acts 4 about "bold dependence"?
- 11. Challenge: Memorize / review Acts 1:8: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."
