

COMMUNITY GROUP QUESTIONS April 30, 2017 Love Can Unbind Us | Luke 15:11-32

Questions for Study and Group Discussion

- ** Before you begin, please read Luke 15:11-32 as a group.
- 1. Have you ever spent an extended time in restricted or cramped quarters? (Maybe packed bleachers at a football game, a small car on a long trip, etc.) How did it feel when you finally had room to stretch / spread out?
- 2. React to this statement: "In one sense, sin prevents us from living the full life Jesus wants for us (John 10:10) and keeps us in 'small, cramped up' lives." What stands out to you in that statement? Does it change the way you think about sin?
- 3. In the parable Jesus tells in Luke 15:11-32, in what ways is the younger brother "bound" (i.e., tied up by sin)?
- 4. Focus in on Luke 15:17-24, and answer the following questions:
 - How does the younger brother expect to be received when he returns home?
 - How does the father actually receive him?
 - Put yourself in the younger son's shoes. How do you think he felt, after his father embraced him and called for a party?
- 5. There's a second son in this parable we can't ignore. Look closely at Luke 15:25-32. In what ways is the older brother "bound"? How does the father respond to this older son?
- 6. In vv. 28-30, we see the older son resist the father and what the father is doing. What's different about the older son's mindset, as compared to the father's?
- 7. Are there ways you see yourself in either the younger brother OR the older brother? Explain.
- 8. What should we learn from this parable, about God the Father's love for us?
- 9. In what ways have you experienced the "unbinding," freeing nature of God's love for you? Explain.
- 10. How can you help others experience this freeing nature of God's love?
