

## **Guarding Against Greed**

Discussion Guide February 4, 2018 Luke 12:13-21

## **Questions for Study**

\*\*Before discussing these questions, read through Luke 12:13-21 as a group.

- 1. What is a blind spot? When you're driving, why is it so important to check your blind spots?
- 2. As we seek to grow in generosity, do you agree that greed can be a blind spot? Share why you answered the way you did.
- 3. What are some of the specific ways greed can manifest itself? Don't just list the obvious answers; be sure and list some of the subtle ways greed can manifest itself. Work as a group to identify at least 6-8 responses.
- 4. As a group, read through Luke 12:13-21. Then answer the following guestions.
  - What stands out as you read through the parable? Does anything surprise you?
  - What is the big point Jesus is trying to get across? Summarize your answer in 1-2 short sentences.
  - Where does the rich landowner in this story go wrong? How does he exhibit greed?
  - Re-tell this story in 21st century language. What would you say?
- 5. The "antidote" to greed is being rich toward God (see v. 21). What does it mean to be rich toward God?
- 6. Look at your responses to the previous question. How can you apply these things in your everyday life? (Get specific!)
- 7. Review what you've learned from Luke 12:13-21. What is one practical take-away from this passage you can apply to your life this week? How will you apply it?
- 8. Challenge: Memorize Luke 12:15: "Then Jesus said to them, 'Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."
