

## The Power of the Gospel

Discussion Guide April 8, 2018 Colossians 1:1-14

## **Questions for Study**

\*\*Before discussing these questions, read through Colossians 1:1-14 as a group.

- 1. Why is a root system so important for plants and trees? What happens if that root system is either absent or shallow?
- 2. Read Colossians 2:6-7 (a theme verse for Colossians). What should followers of Jesus be deeply rooted in, according to this verse? Why is this so important?
- 3. In Colossians 1:6, Paul says the gospel "is bearing fruit and growing throughout the whole world just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and truly understood God's grace."
  - Read Romans 1:16 and 1 Corinthians 15:1-8. Based on these passages, what is the "gospel" that is working in the Colossian Christians?
  - How does Colossians 1:6 (and these other verses you just read) show the power of the gospel?
  - Do you have any personal stories that illustrate the gospel's power in your own life?
- 4. In Colossians 1:9-12, Paul clearly states what he's praying for as he thinks about the Colossians. Make a list of all the things Paul wants to see in these Colossian followers of Jesus from Colossians 1:9-12.
- 5. Do any of these things Paul prays for in Colossians 1:9-12 stand out to you in a special way? Why?
- 6. Choose one of the things you've mentioned from what Paul prays for in Colossians 1:9-12. What might it look like for you to grow in this area, in very practical terms?
- 7. Below you'll see key phrases from Colossians 1:13-14 listed out. Spend time on each phrase observing what it teaches about the work Jesus has done for us:
  - "For He has rescued us from the dominion of darkness..."
  - "...and brought us into the kingdom of the Son He loves..."
  - "...in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins."
- 8. Now put everything from Colossians 1:13-14 together. In your own words, how do these verses show us the good news of what Jesus has done for us (i.e., the gospel)?
- 9. What's one big personal take-away you've learned from Colossians 1:1-14? How can you apply this take -away to your life?
- 10. Challenge: Memorize Colossians 1:1-13-14: <sup>13</sup>For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, <sup>14</sup>in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.
