Discussion Guide November 11, 2018 Luke 11:5-13 & 18:1-8

## **Questions for Study**

\*\* Before you begin, please read Luke 11:5-13 & 18:1-8 as a group.

- 1. To get the group sharing—what have been some of your more recent experiences with prayer? Is it a struggle for you to pray regularly, or is it something that comes naturally to you?
- 2. What is your most frequent motivation for praying? Why do you think that is?
- 3. Why is the approach to prayer found in these two passages so counter-intuitive to us?
- 4. Are these passages saying that we are bothering God when we pray to Him?
- 5. Why are we told to pray this way—persistently and with "shameless audacity"?
- 6. In the Lord's prayer (see Luke 11:2-4 or Matt. 6:9-13), what is the metaphor given for how we should address God? Why is this significant?
- 7. How do little children make asks of their parents? Do you have any personal examples of this?
- 8. Read John 1:12. Talk about the Christian doctrine of "adoption." What does this mean, and what are the implications of this for prayer?
- 9. What were some of the other ways the pastor mentioned that people tend to approach God like?
- 10. Give some thoughts on this quote: "Your Father always gives you what you would've asked for, if you knew everything He knows."
- 11. If you've been asking God for something over and over again (for weeks and months), what might be the reasons He's not given it to you?
- 12. What are some practical tools that you have found helpful for prayer? (Examples might be the "A.C.T.S." acronym, prayer apps like "Echo Prayer", etc.)
