Discussion Guide October 28, 2018 Luke 15:11-32

Questions for Study

** Before you begin, please read Luke 15:11-32 as a group.

- 1. Think about a time when you arrived back at home after a long stay away from your family (maybe a week away at a camp, a semester away at college, coming home for the holidays, etc.). What sort of reception did you receive by your family? Were you ever concerned there wouldn't be a warm welcome?
- 2. Look closely at Luke 15:11-12. How does the younger son leave home? How would this have been culturally offensive?
- 3. The younger separates himself from the loving relationship of his father. In what ways is this a picture of our own sin?
- 4. Now focus in on Luke 15:17-24, and answer the following questions:
 - How does the younger brother expect to be received when he returns home? Why?
 - How does the father actually receive him?
 - Put yourself in the younger son's shoes. How do you think he felt, after his father embraced him and called for a party?
- 5. There's a second son in this parable we can't ignore. Look closely at Luke 15:25-32. Where is the older son located while the party is going on for his younger brother? How does the father respond to this older son?
- 6. In vv. 28-30, we see the older son resist the father and what the father is doing. What's different about the older son's mindset, as compared to the father's?
- 7. What's wrong with the response of the older brother? What might an "older brother" look like today?
- 8. Are there ways you see yourself in either the younger brother OR the older brother? Explain.
- 9. What should we learn from this parable, about God's love for us?
- 10. In what ways have you experienced the extravagant love of God when you "came home" to Him? Explain.
- 11. How can you help others experience this freeing, abundant nature of God's love?
