

Parenting: Making It Count

Discussion Guide | October 13, 2019 Ephesians 6:1-4

Questions for Study and Discussion

**Before you begin, please read Ephesians 6:1-4 as a group.

- 1. Do you think raising kids today is harder or easier (or the same) as it was 100 years ago? Why?
- 2. What are some of the biggest problems or struggles that parents face today?
- 3. Why is it important for the Bible to shape HOW you parent?
- 4. Look closely at Ephesians 6:1-3. What commands does Paul give to children here? What does it look like to live out these commands as younger children? Teenage children? Adult children?
- 5. Paul quotes one of the 10 Commandments, "Honor your father and mother." How does the command to "honor" influence how we understand the command to "obey"?
- 6. For parents, how do you live a life that invites honor?
- 7. In verse 3, what reason(s) does Paul give for the commands in verses 1 and 2? In your own words, summarize what Paul is saying.
- 8. What does it mean to "exasperate" your children (v. 4?) What are some practical ways this might look in everyday life?
- 9. Paul focuses attention on bringing children up "in the training and instruction of the Lord" (v. 4). As a group, brainstorm 6-8 practical ways to do this.
- 10. What other goals do parents have for their kids? How can you keep the goal of v. 4 ("bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord") as a priority in light of everything else clamoring for your attention as parents?
- 11. Read the following passages. After each one, share how it adds to (or how it reinforces) what you've learned about parenting from Ephesians 6:1-4.
 - Deuteronomy 6:1-4
 - Proverbs 22:6

- Mark 10:13-14
- Colossians 3:20-21
- 12. For anyone who has children: What practical steps do you need to take this week to invest fresh attention and effort into godly parenting? For anyone who doesn't have kids: What's your biggest takeaway on parenting from Ephesians 6:1-4 and this discussion as a group?
- 13. **Challenge:** Memorize Ephesians 6:4: "Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord."
