Discussion Guide | March 8, 2020 Exodus 3:1-15

Questions for Study and Discussion

- ** Before you begin, please read Exodus 3:1-15.
- 1. In his classic book, *Knowledge of the Holy*, A.W. Tozer says that "What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us." Why are our beliefs about God so important?
- 2. How can we learn about who God is? Where has He revealed Himself?
- 3. Why is it significant that God has made Himself known? What does this tell us about God? What should this mean for us?
- 4. As a group, work through Exodus 3:1-15, making a list of the many things we learn about God (both who He is and what He's doing) from this passage. Word your findings in a single word or a short phrase.
- 5. Choose one of these truths about God (maybe one that's new to you, or one that you've neglected recently). How can you "lean into" and live in light of this truth about God this coming week?
- 6. God makes Himself known in a burning bush to Moses, and He makes Himself known to the world in Jesus (see John 1:18). How do you see the same truths about God that you learned in Exodus 3, on display in Jesus?
- 7. Author Tim Chester says, "...nothing is less practical than God-lite Christianity." How has what you've learned today given you a big view of God? How does a big (and right) view of God influence your life practically?
- 8. What are you facing this coming week, that needs to be shaped by what you've learned about who God is (and what He's doing)?
- 9. **Challenge: Psalm 145:3-4:** 3 Great is the Lord and most worthy of praise; his greatness no one can fathom. 4 One generation commends your works to another; they tell of your mighty acts.
