SERMON APPLICATION GUIDE

John 18:1-11

Ice Breaker: Share an evidence of God's grace you've seen or experienced this week.

Ice Breaker: Share a time in your life when, in the moment, it didn't feel like God was in control, but He was.

DISCUSSION: Arresting Jesus

- 1. How does Jesus display his complete, sovereign control over his arrest?
- 2. Three times Jesus declares, "I am he" to those seeking to arrest him. What is significant about this response in this text and in the whole book of John?
- 3. Why does Jesus not retaliate against this unlawful arrest but rather give himself over Is there a situation where it would be right to pick up "the sword" in the name of Jesus? Why or why not? (I Peter 2:13-25)?
- 4. What are some ways we act like Peter and think we should take a situation into our own hands when instead we should remember Jesus has complete control? What does it say about our faith when we seek to control a situation we have not control over?
- 5. What are evidences that show we are truly trusting God is in control?
- 6. What does Jesus mean when he says, "shall I not drink the cup that my Father has given me?" What is the cup his is going to drink?
- 7. Knowing that Jesus has taken God's wrath for our sin upon himself, how does that change the way we respond to our own sin and the sin of others?
- 8. What is a biblical response to the question, "who killed Jesus?" (Is. 53:10; Acts 2:22-24)

FAMILY DISCIPLESHIP QUESTIONS

- 1. Why can we trust God even when our circumstances seem dark and out of control?
- 2. What do we need to remind ourselves we when feel we are suffering unjustly?
