SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE

I Kings 6:1-13

Ice Breaker: Our new Castleton Community Church mission statement is <u>leading people</u> <u>to know and trust Jesus</u>. Discuss among your group it's meaning and how it should be lived out.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1. **Recap:** What has happened so far in I Kings? What happened right before our passage? What is the kingdom like at this point in Solomon's reign?
- 2. It's been 480 years since the Israelites were freed from slavery in Egypt. What does the beginning temple construction signify in redemptive history? What is different about the Temple vs. the tabernacle?
- 3. A cubit is about 18 inches. What were the dimensions of this temple? Any observations stick out about the specs of the temple?
- 4. What is the significance in vs. 7 of limiting sound as they built the temple? (Hab. 2:20) What role does silence play in our own spiritual disciplines?
- 5. In the middle of Solomon's work, God speaks to Solomon in vs.11-13. What does God remind Solomon at this important time in Israel's history? Despite the importance of the visible temple, what was God was primarily concerned with concerning His people?
- 6. In what ways are is the Church tempted towards focusing on outward appearances rather than internal obedience? Why is it so common for Christians to put up appearances, especially at the gathering of believers?
- 7. How do the truths of the gospel help us be "real" with those within the household of God?
- 8. Even though Israel forsakes their God, how does God fulfill his promise to not forsake them? How does God dwell with his children today?

- 1. What was the purpose for Solomon to build the temple? Where does God live today?
- 2. Listen to <u>Brick After Brick</u> by Sovereign Grace Music and discuss what it means for God to build his temple today meaning with his people.
