SERMON APPLICATION GUIDE

Ephesians 2:12-16, 3:10

Ice Breaker: Describe a unique friendship you have with someone who apart from the gospel might not otherwise share a friendship?

Ice Breaker: What is one evidence of God's grace you've seen this week?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1. What does Ephesians 3:10 say about God's purpose for the church?
- 2. How did God accomplish unity in His church? What is the foundation of our unity? (see Eph. 2:12-16)
- 3. What makes the gathering of God's people (the church) unique from other gatherings the world can produce? What does the church offer that no other group of people can offer?
- 4. Name some ways the American church has struggled to display a compelling unity to a watching world?
- 5. How can we make sure that we don't create a church community that is "sub-Christian" and looks just like the world?
- 6. What sins might creep in that could destroy our unity in Christ? How does the idol of comfort propose a threat to a biblical unity in diversity in our church?
- 7. How does the vision of Is. 11:10 and Rev. 5:7-14, compel us to welcome all peoples into our fellowship? What's a practical first step you and your small group can make to work towards this vision?
- 8. What are takeaways from this series on *Biblical Unity in Diversity* that most impacted you? What principles taught from this series do you want to commit to memory?
