## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:**

1. What is the context of 1 Corinthians? What kinds of things does Paul talk about in this book?

- 2. **Read 1 Corinthians 7:6-9:** Who is this passage written to? What are some things that stand out to you in this passage about singleness?
- 3. What was or is your experience of singleness?
  - 1. If you are married now, how was your singleness encouraged or discouraged before marriage? What do you remember about the encouragement to get married?
  - 2. If you are single, how is your current experience at Castleton as a single? Do you feel supported or encouraged in your singleness? How have people talked about marriage with you? (Be honest!)
- 4. How can singleness be "good" for the church family? How does singleness show the gospel in unique ways to our church body?
- 5. How can we honor the singles in our church in a way that encourages them to continue to pursue the Lord in their unique way? What ways can you personally do this?
- 6. What ways can we unintentionally discourage singleness and make singleness seem "less" than "married"? Why is it important to be careful with our words about singleness and marriage?
- 7. If you are single, what does it look like to have intentional devotion to the Lord? What are some ways you are maybe already doing this as the Lord allows?
- 8. If you are married, how might you, even now, prepare yourself if the Lord takes your spouse home and you remain in this life as a window? What kinds of things would you want to give yourself to? How has the Lord gifted you or positioned you now to make a gospel impact in the future?

**Application**: Pray (by name) for the single members of our church. Pray that they would not be discouraged by the counter-cultural position that they are in but rather see it as a gift from the Lord.
