



#6 "HONOR BOUNDARIES"

1. Set boundaries on your relationship _____.

Luke 6:31 (TLB) Treat others as you want them to treat you.

Colossians 3:8 (NIV) But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips.

Proverbs 25:17 (TPT) Don't wear out your welcome by staying too long at the home of your friends, or they may get fed up with always having you there and wish you hadn't come.

2. Set boundaries on your personal _____.

Emotional boundaries include:

- ▶ Processing your anger.

Ephesians 4:26-27 (NIV) In your anger do not sin: Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, and do not give the devil a foothold.

- ▶ Dealing with your hurts and disappointments.

Hebrews 12:15 (NIV) See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many.

- ▶ Refusing to blame others for your issues.
- ▶ Resisting the urge to resent and retaliate against others.

Romans 12:17-19 (NIV) Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord.

Romans 12:21 (NIV) Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

3. Set boundaries on how you define your personal _____.

Mark 12:31 (NIV) The second is this: "Love your neighbor as yourself." There is no commandment greater than these.

Isaiah 43:1 (NIV) But now, this is what the LORD says—he who created you, Jacob, he who formed you, Israel: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine."

1 John 4:9-10 (NIV) This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

4. Set boundaries on your _____.

James 3:2 (TPT) We all fail in many areas, but especially with our words. Yet if we're able to bridle the words we say we are powerful enough to control ourselves in every way, and that means our character is mature and fully developed.

James 3:6 (TPT) And the tongue is a fire! It can be compared to the sum total of wickedness and is the most dangerous part of our human body. It corrupts the entire body and is a hellish flame! It releases a fire that can burn throughout the course of human existence.

5. Set boundaries on your _____ and _____.

2 Thessalonians 3:11-12 (AMP) Indeed, we hear that some among you are leading an undisciplined and inappropriate life, doing no work at all, but acting like busybodies [meddling in other people's business]. Now such people we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to settle down and work quietly and earn their own food and other necessities [supporting themselves instead of depending on the hospitality of others].
