1. REVIEW THE SERMON

Read 1 John 2:1. John says he is writing his letter so that his readers will not sin. Why do we often “play around” with sin, rather than avoiding sin at all costs?

How would you define the word advocate using your own words? Why is it important that Jesus Christ is our advocate before the Father?

Read 1 John 2:2. Why is it significant that Jesus has “satisfied” God’s righteous wrath for those that are in Christ? What about those who reject Christ’s sacrifice for sins? (See John 3:36)

Re-read 1 John 2:2. According to this verse, whose sin did Jesus take on when he died on the cross? How should this truth motivate us in the area of evangelism and sharing our faith?

2. ASSESS YOUR HEART

Do you find yourself trying to earn God’s favor? How might the truths of 1 John 2:1-2 be an encouragement for us to stop trying to earn God’s favor?

3. APPLY THE TRUTH

How can you walk in the truth this week that Jesus is **both** our advocate and the propitiation for our sin?
