A traveler's life in light of the return of Christ...

- Live self-controlled and sober-mindedly (v7)

FOR FURTHER STUDY...

Love Each Other Earnestly

The word "earnestly" (or "deeply" in some translations) means "stretched" or "strained" and was used to describe the athlete who runs strenuously to finish their race in the best possible way. Consider that word picture applied to love.

We are not being instructed to have deep feelings for one another, but rather to actively and strenuously love one another. This means we must act - and act sacrificially. As one commentator puts it, "This kind of strenuously maintained love is not blind, but sees and accepts the flaws of others." We love not just those who are worthy of love, but all, and especially our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Peter doesn't just tell us to love strenuously though; he also describes what that love will look like. It will cause us to sacrifice our home and food. It cause us to speaks words of encouragement and challenge. It will cause us to serve and to give up our time and strength. It will cause us to give up our own resources and talents in love - so that Jesus Christ would be glorified in our action.
