- 3. Read Lamentations 4:11-17. What is the primary emotion you feel after reading this text? Why?
- 4. This lament emphasizes the sins of Judah's leaders. What sin were they guilty of, based on these verses? Where do you see this in our culture?

5.	In Lamentations 4:17 we read the people's acknowledgment that they were helpless to save themselves. Can you remember a time when you were out of sync in your relationship with God but didn't know why? How did God lead you to repentance?
6.	Has God ever used you to lead someone else to repentance? How did He use you? How would you characterize your relationship with Him at that time?
7.	Read Colossians 2:13-15. How does what God did at the cross compare with what we read about Him doing to Jerusalem in Lamentations?
8.	What did Jesus' death accomplish for us and for our world?
9.	Who are the "rulers and authorities" in verse 15? What has Christ done to them?
10	.How might a greater awareness of Christ's power and authority give you confidence to live for Him and share the Gospel?

11.Read 1 Corinthians 15:3-8. How would you summarize the main points of the Gospel in your own words? What emotions come to the surface when you read verses 3-5?
12. Why is it important to include Jesus' resurrection when we discuss the Gospel?
