Series Sermon-based Growth Group John "Moving Christmas" Luke 2:1-7 Questions December 5, 2021

Introductory Discussion:

What from Sunday's sermon did you find most helpful, or eye-opening, or troubling (pick any or all of the above)?

Discussion:

- 1. Think about times you had to move. What was lost? What was gained?
 - a. Can you look back and see how those moves were a step in your Christian journey?
- 2. How did God use Caesar to further His goals (verse 1)?
 - a. How does Jesus coming as a baby tell us about how God works out His plans?
- 3. What does it symbolize about our relationship with God that the temple was a tent and he was a cloud and a pillar of fire that guided the Israelites?
- 4. Where is the true temple?
 - a. How does that help God move?
- 5. Mary and Joseph knew that they were headed to Bethlehem where they knew that the savior she was carrying would be born. How do you think that made them feel?
 - a. Think of where you are going to end up. How should that make you feel about what is going on in your life right now?
 - b. Can we trust that God is in control when those in power don't behave the way we think they should?
 - c. How does knowing that God is in control help us deal with government and bosses and other authorities in our lives?
- 6. How did Jesus deal with those in authority who opposed him? Give examples.
 - a. How can we use him as a model in how we deal with our authorities?
 - b. How does Philippians 2:5-7 affect how you deal with others in your life?

Philippians 2:5-7: "Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but empiled himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of man. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."
