Introductory Discussion: What from the sermon did you find most helpful, or eye-opening, or challenging?

- 1. As a Christian, what should you ultimately want to happen with your enemies?
 - a. How does that change how you respond to conflict?
- 2. What is the principle behind "an eye for an eye"?
 - a. How can it be abused or misunderstood?
- 3. Matthew 5:39 essentially says not to retaliate. Why should we resist retaliating and holding grudges?
 - a. How is that an act of faith?
 - b. Why should we accept an insult and give them another opportunity?
- 4. What message does it send to someone when you are forced to do something that you go above and beyond (verse 41)?
- 5. Why should our default attitude be to give to those in need (verse 42)?
 - a. How does that change us?
- 6. Why do we feel a need to get revenge?
 - a. Who benefits?
 - b. If you love your enemy, who benefits?

- 7. How does loving your enemy make you a "child of your father in heaven " (verse 45)?
 - a. What do verses 44 and 45 tell us about how God treats his "enemies?"
- 8. Verse 48 tells us to be perfect, complete, or mature. Do you get there by trying harder?
 - a. How do we pursue righteousness?
