 - a. If you find it necessary to bring others down, what does it say about the state of your heart?
 - b. How do we change that?
- 3. Why does insulting someone put you in danger of hell?
- 4. Why should you reconcile with those you have wronged before you try to worship God?
 - a. What are you saying to God if you try to commune with Him while still harming other people?
- 5. According to verses 25 and 26, if you owe someone, why should you deal with it as soon as possible?
- 6. How are murder, reconciling with those you have wronged, and paying debts related to each other?
- 7. How does Jesus's explanation of "Thou shalt not murder" relate to "fulfilling the law"?
- 8. What do we do about our murderous hearts?
